## **Trefloyne Golf Club Competition Rule Book**

This document details the general and specific requirements for club competitions held at Trefloyne Golf Club.

# **General Requirements for Competition Play**

Players must have an official Handicap Index to enter competitions. Competitions are limited to full members only.

Every player is personally responsible for playing in accordance with the Rules of Golf, Rules of Handicapping and any specific local or competition rules. Any breach of the rules is subject to penalty up to and including disqualification. Serious deliberate breaches may lead to disciplinary action being taken against the player(s) involved.

From 1 March 2024 entry to all silverware competitions will be restricted to players who have submitted 6 scorecards for handicapping purposes in the 12 months prior to entering the competition. This rule does not apply to Saturday, Tuesday and Thursday roll-ups.

Players who have not submitted the required 6 scorecards may play in the silverware games (not match-play knockouts) and submit a scorecard but cannot win the competition.

#### **Match Play Competitions**

The Club runs several match play knockout competitions during the spring and summer period. The rules, format and entry limitations of each competition are listed in Table 1 below.

Entries will open in early April and close at a date set by the Competition Committee. Entry fees for the competition must be paid in full by the entry closing date otherwise the entrant will be excluded from the draw. The draw will be made by the Competition Committee as soon as practicable after the closing date.

The draw for each competition will be posted on the Club competition website (currently Masterscoreboard) and on appropriate locker room noticeboards. The draw sheet for each competition will state the last date for each round to be completed by, including the final. All matches in a round would have to be played on or before that date.

# **Club Knockout Competition Rules**

The top name(s) in each match of every competition will be considered to be the home player(s) and therefore responsible for making the arrangements to play the match. The player(s) considered to be the away player(s) in the above context will be given the honour on the first tee.

If there are issues agreeing a date, they must refer the matter to the Competition Committee, at least 7 clear days before the last date of that round, for their adjudication.

Matches not played by the due date will be subject to consideration of disqualification unless good cause can be shown such as bereavement, course closure and lightning. Course closure decisions will be made by the Head Greenkeeper or by the Professional Team.

If a member has entered multiple competitions and is unable to play them by the deadline, they will have to forfeit the match.

If a partner entered in a pairs competition is unable to play their first and any subsequent matches due to sudden debilitating illness or injury, then that player may be substituted for another. The substitute must be a new entrant to the competition and must satisfy the entry conditions. Substitution is otherwise not allowed but one player in a pair may play against two opponents in fourball better ball format.

If any match is not finished by the 18th hole, the players will continue until a result is agreed on a sudden death basis in accordance with Rules of Golf Rule 3.2a(4) i.e. holes are played in the same order as the round starting at the 1<sup>st</sup> hole until one side wins a hole.

When each game has been completed, the winning player or team must record the result on the draw sheet in their changing room and inform the Pro Shop Staff as soon as possible to allow the maximum time to arrange the next round. The result of the match is final once the result is recorded on the draw sheet.

Any disputes must be referred quickly to the Competition Committee for a decision.

### **Stroke Play Competitions**

The Club runs several stroke play competitions throughout the year, some of which are restricted to certain categories of players/members, as detailed in the Table 2 below.

Entries are usually on a roll-up basis on the day at the Professional's Shop where entry fees are paid, and competition cards issued. Cards should be returned to the Professional's shop on completion of the round or placed in the locked competition card box outside.

## **Stroke Play Scorecard Completion and Return**

The player must ensure the following information is completed on the scorecard before returning it to the club (see Rule of Golf Rule 3.3 and Rules of Handicapping Rule 4.1).

- Name of player
- Date of competition
- Tee played from
- Clearly visible Gross hole scores (or NS/NR where applicable) for all holes
- Marker's signature
- Player's signature

The marker is responsible for entering hole scores during play of the round and signing the card at the end of the round to certify the player's scores. The player is responsible for checking the gross scores at the end of the round and signing to certify they are correct.

In addition, the club requests that players ensure the marker's name is entered on the card in the space provided.

If, due to exceptional circumstances, another marker takes over marking during a round then the original marker must sign to certify the hole scores they have marked on the card.

Correctly completed scorecards should be submitted at the earliest opportunity on completion of the round. If a competition scorecard is not returned to the club, the player will be disqualified. In addition, follow up action may be taken to either determine the score made or apply a penalty score for handicapping purposes. If a player repeatedly fails to return their scorecards for competitions, they may be subject to disciplinary action including suspension of their Handicap Index.

The above requirements for stroke play competitions also apply to players completing a preregistered General Play round or an away competition within the jurisdiction of the national golf union, Wales Golf. Away scores valid for handicapping purposes played outside Wales should be submitted to the club as soon as possible after the date of play.

# **Stroke Play Competition Tie Resolution**

Usually, ties in stroke play competitions will be decided on countback. Where two or more rounds are played, the determination of the winner will be based on the best score for the last round. If the tying players have the same score for the last round or if the competition consisted of a single round, the determination of the winner will be based on the score for the last nine holes, last six holes, last three holes and finally the 18th hole. If there is still a tie, then the last six holes, three holes and final hole of the first nine holes will be considered in turn. If the round is less than 18 holes, the number of holes used in matching scores may be adjusted.

If this process does not result in a winner, the Committee could consider the competition a tie, or alternatively could decide the winner by chance (such as tossing a coin).

#### **Twos Competition**

Usually, a twos competition is run alongside stroke play competitions. Any player making a gross hole score of two or lower during the round will take an equal share of the twos prize fund, provided the scorecard they returned is acceptable for handicapping purposes in accordance with the Rules of Handicapping.

#### **Junior Golfers**

Junior golfers who hold a valid handicap are eligible to play in all competitions where they meet the entry criteria i.e. other than competitions for seniors there are no age requirements or restrictions at Trefloyne.

#### Notes:

- 1. In individual and fourball match play competitions, each players' playing handicap is a rounded 100% of their Course Handicap (plus any applicable mixed tee adjustment). In individual match play, the player with the higher handicap gets shots equal to the difference between Playing Handicaps. In fourball match play, players get shots equal to 90% of the difference between their Playing Handicap and the lowest Playing Handicap in the fourball.
- 2. In greensome foursomes match play, the unrounded 60% and 40% Course Handicaps are added together then rounded to determine the playing handicap. Course Handicaps are calculated using the Course Rating of the tee played from and the specified tee for SI/par (i.e. for Alice Shapcott, Yellow CR for Men, Red CR for Women and Red Tee Par for both players). Shots are then taken off the pair with the lowest Playing Handicap.
- 3. All competitions to be played over 18 holes, in the order of holes 1-18, with a tied match to be decided in accordance with Rules of Golf Rule 3.2a(4).

- 4. Wesley House Cup entrants must have a handicap index of 15.4 or less on the day entries open and must play off no more than that handicap limit during the event.
- 5. In the Tee(s) and Par/SI columns above, 'M' denotes the male (Men's) tee and 'F' denotes the female (Women's) tees. In the Tee(s) column, this relates to the tees to be played from and appropriate Course Handicap chart to be used. In the Par/SI column, this denotes which Par and Stroke Index will be used for Course Handicap calculation and scoring purposes.

#### Notes:

- 1. Medals will have one category only. White tee availability for Medals and Roll-ups may be restricted during autumn and winter. In such cases, men's yellow tee (or winter yellow) will be used for medals.
- 2. Players playing different stroke play competitions on the same day e.g., Tiger Chalice and Hubbard Rabbits Trophy, may play in the same grouping unless specific groupings have been determined by the Competition Committee.
- 3. Club Championship second round groupings will be determined in reverse gross score order, with lowest first round gross score teeing off last. Groupings will be determined separately for ladies' and men's club championship competitors.
- 4. Bush House Pairs Stableford pairings will be drawn at random and may consist of either gender playing together e.g., 2 male, 2 female or male and female.
- 5. If the Meurig Evans Shield winner is also the best net scorer, the Ireland Cup will be awarded to the second-best net score.
- 6. All competition rounds are to be played from holes 1 to 18, unless specifically stated otherwise above or by the Competition Committee on the day.
- 7. In the Brian Anderson Cup players with a handicap index above 24 may still play but must play off a handicap index of 24. The score submitted for handicapping purposes will use the actual full course handicap.

- 8. An Order of Merit trophy will be awarded to the player with the best five net scores out of eight played in Monthly Medals in the period March through October. Ties will be decided by the best last 9 holes (using the players' best scores). If there is still a tie, the best last 6 holes are matched (then last 3 holes and finally best last hole, as required).
- 9. In the Tee(s) and Par/SI columns above, 'M' denotes the male (Men's) tee and 'F' denotes the female (Women's) tees. In the Tee(s) column, this relates to the tees to be played from and appropriate Course Handicap chart to be used. In the Par/SI column, this denotes which Par and Stroke Index will be used for Course Handicap calculation and scoring purposes.
- 10. Where a mixed tee adjustment applies to a player in individual or 4BBB medal stroke play (and match play), the playing handicap is rounded after the mixed tee adjustment is applied to the unrounded percentage of course handicap. The mixed tee adjustment is the difference between the par of the tees being played and the lowest par of tees being played in the mixed tee competition.
- 11.In greensome foursomes stroke play and stableford/par/bogey, the unrounded 60% and 40% Course Handicaps are added together then rounded to determine the playing handicap. Course Handicaps are calculated using the Course Rating of the tee played from and the specified tee for SI/par (i.e. for Whitewell Cup, Yellow CR for Men, Red CR for Women and Red Tee Par for both players).
- 12. The unrounded Course Handicap is used when calculating the playing handicap.
